Listening Activity.

 Click on this audio icon and listen to "The Triumphant Procession" from **Peter and the Wolf** by **Sergei Prokofiev**.

1. During this excerpt a procession can be heard as the wolf is taken to the zoo. Describe what you hear in the music that tells us what is happening e.g. what characters can be heard and how do you think they're feeling.

Firstly, Peter's theme is heard (proud and triumphant) followed by the hunters and the wolf (sounding a bit sheepish). Grandfather comes next, (sounding grumpy), together with the cat (still sounding jaunty).

The bird can be heard flying above (very excitedly).

2. How does the music show that the duck doesn't die when he is swallowed by the wolf?

The duck's theme can be heard, played slowly, sadly and a bit muffled!
